## Death

Executed by crucifixion upside-down

Death uncertain, but no official persecution was ongoing at this time

Martyred

Banished by Emperor Trajan; later tied to anchor and thrown in sea

Uncertain, though in office during Trajan's government

Uncertain, though in office during Trajan's government

Tradition holds he was martyred

Church Father St. Irenaeus called him a great martyr.

Death uncertain

Early tradition holds he was martyred; disputed today

Martyred during time of Marcus Aurelius

Name appears in many early martyrologies

Death uncertain

Death uncertain

Not officially executed but suffered greatly during reign of Emperor Severus

Martyred

Death uncertain

First pope to abdicate after exile to Sardinia for labor in mines by Emperor Maximinus Thrax.

Tradition holds he was martyred

Died a martyr through extreme hardship during Decian persecution

Exiled to Centumcellae, Italy, and died shortly thereafter

Probably NOT martyred

Martyred by beheading, disputed

Martyred by beheading under Valerian persecution

Natural death (beginning of office coincides with "Little Peace of the Church" which lasts for about 40 years)

Probably NOT martyred

Probably NOT martyred

Death uncertain, but lived prior to last great persecution under Diocletian

Death uncertain; probably natural

Banished from Rome under Maxentius (309), died shortly thereafter

Banished by the emperor Maxentius, and died in exile.

Natural death; first pope after the end of the persecution of Christians through the Edict of Milan (313 AD)
